



2008 Cub Scout Summer Resident Camp “SUPER STARS”



When: Sunday, June 29th through Tuesday, July 1st (Check-in is at 2pm on Sunday.)

Who can attend: Cub Scout Resident Camp (CSRC) is open to ALL Cub Scouts that will be in the 2nd through the 5th grade at the beginning of the 2008-2009 school year OR those who will be Wolves through Webelos in the fall.

Fees: \$95 per Scout (if registration is turned in before May 10th) or \$110 per Scout (after May 10th)

\$35 per adult, (volunteer and get a FREE staff shirt)

\$7 per meal for additional family members. For the family meal Tuesday evening, families should plan on showing up around 6:30pm.

What is Cub Scout Resident Camp: CSRC is a 2 night, 2 ½ day outdoor experience at Will Rogers Scout Reservation. Activities will include swimming, BB Guns, Archery, boating, and several special “Super Star” guests!

How do I sign up: Fill out the attached application and send it in to the Council Service Center in Enid. Each Scout and adult must fill out an application separately. More applications can be printed off our Council website at www.cimarronbsa.org.

Who do I contact for more information: We have lots of fun and exciting activities planned and we need adult volunteers to help make our camp a great success for all the boys! A few special notes about our Resident Camp Program:



- **Egg Drop**—There will be an egg drop during camp. Please bring your own supplies to create an egg-cellent box to keep your egg safe during the drop. You may test your box before camp (eggs will be provided at the camp drop).

- **Advancement in Camp**—Most of the camp's activities will meet a Cub Scout or Webelos advancement requirement, although some activities are just for fun! A checklist of the advancement opportunities possible during camp will be provided to each boy at the end of the session. It is the responsibility of the parents of the Wolf and Bear Scouts and the Den Leaders of Webelos Scouts to determine if the activity was satisfactorily completed to meet the specific advancement requirement and to record it in the youth's handbook.



- **Cub Scout Academics and Sports Belt Loops and Pins**—Cub Scouts will have the opportunity to earn several Academic and Sports Belt Loops while at camp. A record of all the belt loops and pins earned at camp will be provided to the boys.
- **Program Sessions**—During your stay at CSRC, the Cubs will participate in program stations, which will include BB-Gun Shooting* and Sling Shots, Target Archery*, Fishing*, Boating. (*Denotes an opportunity to earn a Sports Pin)
- **Meals**—All meals are provided as a part of your CSRC camp fee and will be served in the dining hall. **Additional family members can be purchased at \$7/meal.**

Leadership Requirements:

In keeping with the two-deep leadership policies of the Boy Scouts of America, there are two leadership options while attending CSRC.

Option one is for a boy to come to camp with an adult partner. This adult partner should be a parent or guardian, or can be an adult approved by the parents. If the adult partner is not a parent or guardian of the boy, the adult must be at least 21 years of age and have the written permission of a parent or guardian to accompany the boy to camp.

Option two is for a den or pack to attend CSRC under their pack's leadership. If exercising this option the pack/den must provide a minimum of two-deep leadership and maintain a ratio of at least one adult for every four boys. Under this option, at least one of the adults must be at least 21 years of age and a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America. The other adult must be at least 18 years of age and a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America or parents of the boys attending CSRC.

What to expect at Will Rogers Scout Reservation:

- **Tenting & Sleeping Requirements**—Campers are required to provide their own tent(s) for CSRC. Tents need to be of adequate size for each person in the tent. *Adults and boys are not allowed to sleep in the same unless the adult is the parent of the boy.*
- **Restrooms and Showers**—Several campsites share a central restroom facility with flushing toilets and individual hot showers. Each camper is responsible for their own towels, soap, shampoo and other person toiletries while at camp.
- **How do we get to Will Rogers Scout Reservation?** Will Rogers is 4 ½ miles west of Cleveland, OK. It is right off the Cimarron Turnpike (U.S. 412). The Hallett Exit (State Highway 99) at the toll booth is the best exit to take. Proceed north on Highway 99 through the town of Hallett. Five miles north this road runs into U.S. 64 Highway. Veer to the right (east) and go one mile to the top of the hill. The camp entrance is on the left (north) side of the road where you will see a large camp entrance sign.

Refund Policy *Written refund requests will only be considered if received in the Council Service Center 10 days prior to the start of the activity. *Written refund requests submitted after the event will be considered only for personal illness or family emergencies. No refund requests will be accepted after 10 days following the end of the activity. *A service charge of 20% of the full activity fee will be assessed on all refunds. *Refund checks will be issued within 30 days following the end of the event to the individual or entity paying the original fee. *Fees, less the service fee of 20%, are only transferable within the same unit to a Scout or adult leader not currently registered for the event. *In the event that an activity is cancelled or postponed by the council or district and a member cannot participate during the alternate date, the full fee will be refunded.
